There is a divine sovereignty I invite to me by my words and actions, aims of which, known, unknown, admired or misunderstood, by the very merit that they are rightfully mine by every measure and by originality of and origination from thought. This may be affirmed as love and appreciation or refer as hatred and loathing depending on what being it may be relatable.

I have no luck. Yet, there is no such luck as pure admiration. Such privileges are for the dead and those who refuse to live as they are for the utmost of their true lot in life. I drench myself in the affirmation of my utmost essence and existence. For every harm that comes to me as price, I call the good to me in exponential capacity as there is nothing easy in being as I am in dire conditions. If I knew how to be otherwise, I would be extremely likable, un-menaced by the hateful and harmful. If I live as truth, individuality, humanity and spirituality today, may my life in the due course of time, never be some legend for trifling cheap hateful minds.

Life sometimes indulges means and ends that are not justifiable but I am resonantly abiding by my decision to make my life justiable in reference to myself and to others.
